Old Cheney, 70th Street & Holmes Lake Trails



This month, we're featuring a collection of trails in southeast Lincoln that link together to create a variety of route options. The Old Cheney Trail connects multiple major trails across the city, the 70th Street Trail offers a north–south connector, and the Holmes Lake Trail provides a scenic loop that's perfect for fall mornings.

Trail Instructions:

Old Cheney Trail - 5.73 Miles

The Old Cheney Trail runs along the north side of Old Cheney Road and links six other trails: Jamaica North, Rock Island, Tierra-Williamsburg, Boosalis, 70th Street, and 84th Street.

Start Options:

- Park at Christ Place Church (14th & Old Cheney) and walk west to the intersection with the Jamaica North Trail.
- Or, start on the east end by parking near the gas station at 84th & Old Cheney.

Highlights:

- The official trail sign is located at the Rock Island Trail intersection, just west of 14th Street.
- On the west end, the trail connects into the Jamaica North Trail, and on the east end, it ties into the 84th Street Trail.









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Trail Instructions (continued):

70th Street Trail - 2.32 Miles

The 70th Street Trail runs from Old Cheney Road (south end) to Old Post Road (north end), just a half mile from where Normal Blvd. intersects 70th near Holmes Lake.

• Start Options:

- a. South End: Park at Sheridan Lutheran Church and walk north to reach the start.
- b. North End: Park at DaVinci's at 70th & Van Dorn, then head south toward Old Post Road.
- c. Holmes Lake: Park anywhere near the lake and connect either north to Old Post Road or south to Old Cheney.

Highlights:

- The trail begins on the east side of 70th Street, then crosses over to the west side at Glynoaks Drive.
- The north trailhead is at Old Post Road.









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Trail Instructions (continued):

Holmes Lake Trail - 2.32 Miles

The Holmes Lake Trail is a scenic loop that circles the lake, making it one of Lincoln's most popular recreation spots.

- **Start Options:** Park anywhere around the lake and begin your loop in either direction.
- Highlights:
 - The trail offers open lake views, rolling green space, and plenty of spots to pause and take in the scenery.
 - Great for walkers, runners, or anyone looking for a shorter, relaxed route.
